

You must apply even if you already have siblings in school. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application.

As we are a faith school you will also need to complete a supplementary form that you will find on the last page of our admissions policy that you will find on our school website.

The closing date for primary applications for September 2024 is 23:59 on 15 January 2024.

It's quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of your application.

You must apply even if you already have siblings in school. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application.

Corpus Christi and Our Lady's Catholic High School will need you to complete a supplementary faith form which you will find on their websites.

The closing date for secondary applications for September 2024 is 23:59 on 31 October 2023.

## Attendance!




99% of our parents are now successfully using the Arbor App! Hopefully, most of our initial teething issues have now been ironed out. There is still an issue of Emails going into your Junk Mail, we are aware of this and are currently in the process of trying to resolve this. Until then, please keep an eye out in your Junk Mail folder for any correspondence from school.

In order to know when new messages are sent, please turn on your app notifications on your mobile device.

If you are still not on the Arbor App and would like to join or are having any issues with joining then please contact the school office.

In order for this to run smoothly we need you to make us aware of any changes that you may have to your contact information, in particular your email address.

Please be aware that any credit and any debts from Parent Pay will be carried over to Arbor. Any future payments paid via the parent pay app will be refunded apart from the Castlerigg trip and the Borwick trip Hall trip, these will remain on Parent pay.
