

Vocabulary

<i>sentences in different forms</i>	Statement, question, exclamation and command.
<i>inference</i>	A conclusion reached on the basis of evidence and reasoning.
<i>fiction</i>	Writing about events that have not really happened.
<i>non-fiction</i>	Writing about real things and true events.
<i>array</i>	A set of objects or numbers arranged in order, often in rows or columns.
<i>Commutative</i>	Addition and multiplication can be done in any order.
<i>division</i>	Division can be done as sharing or grouping.
<i>properties of 2D shapes</i>	Sides and vertices.
<i>properties of 3D shapes</i>	Edges, vertices (vertex) and faces.
<i>investigation</i>	Scientific investigation is asking and attempting to answer a question.
<i>data</i>	Data is the word used to describe any kind of information that has been collected and can be analysed.
<i>percussion</i>	Percussion instruments make a sound when they are struck, shaken, scraped or rubbed.

Count on and back in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s.
Recognise the place value of each digit in a 2 digit number.

Choose and use appropriate standard units to estimate and measure mass.

Identify and describe properties of 2D and 3D shapes.
To recognise and use symbols for pounds and pence and combine amounts.

Understand multiplication as repeated addition and that it is commutative.

Understand division as grouping or sharing.
