

## Vocabulary

<b>E-Safety</b>	The safe and responsible use of technology.
<b>Growth Mindset</b>	Individuals who believe their talents can be developed through hard work and good strategies.
<b>Twisted Traditional Tale</b>	A traditional tale where we might change the character or setting.
<b>Instructions</b>	Detailed information about how something should be done or operated.
<b>Place Value</b>	The value of each digit in a number. For example, the 5 in 350 represents 5 tens, or 50.
<b>Repeated Addition</b>	Repeated addition is the repetition of equal groups of a number, added together to get an answer. For example, $5+5+5+5=20$
<b>Judaism</b>	Judaism is one of the oldest monotheistic religions and was founded over 3500 years ago in the Middle East.
<b>Coding</b>	Each line of the code is a set of instructions for the computer. A set of codes form a script, and a set or dozens of sets, form a program.
<b>Programming</b>	The process of creating a set of instructions that tell a computer how to perform a task.

## Maths Key Skills

**Science:** To learn all about forces and have the opportunity to experiment and complete lots of investigations.

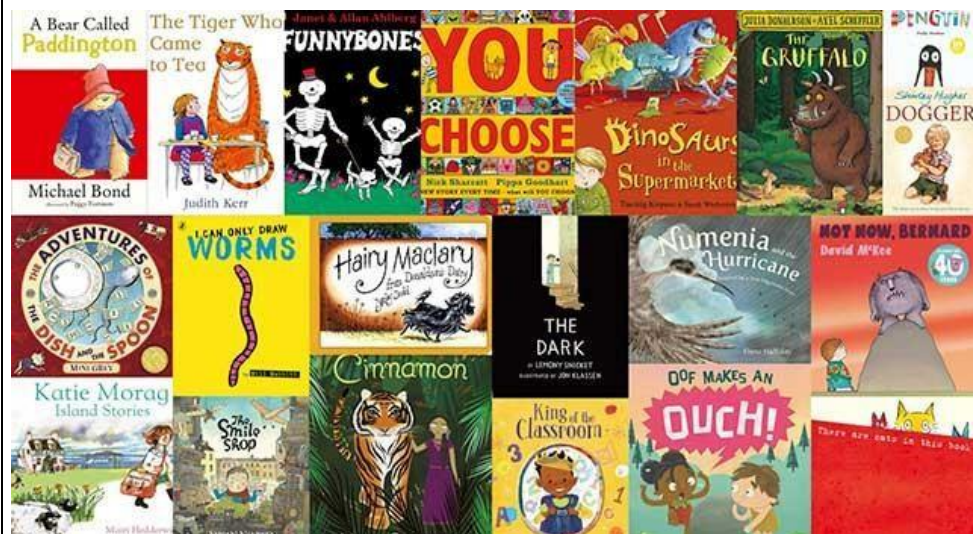
**Computing:** Children will learn about how to stay safe online. We will also look at coding and programming.
