

Vocabulary

prefix	A group of letters that change the meaning of a word when they are added to the start.
suffix	A letter or group of letters that goes on the end of a word and changes the word's meaning.
circumference	The distance around the edge of a circle (or any curvy shape).
radius	The distance from the centre to the circumference of a circle
diameter	The distance from one point on a circle through the centre to another point on the circle.
oxygen	Is vital for respiration, which is the process that transfers energy from glucose to cells.
carbon-dioxide	A colourless, odourless gas otherwise known as CO ₂ , that is produced through combustion and respiration.
circulatory system	The system that circulates blood and lymph through the body, consisting of the heart, blood vessels, blood, lymph, and the lymphatic vessels and glands.
algorithm	A process or set of rules to be followed in calculations or other problem-solving operations, especially by a computer
decomposition	Breaking down a complex problem or system into smaller parts that are more manageable and easier to understand

Maths Key Skills

To describe positions on the full coordinate grid (all four quadrants)

To draw and translate simple shapes on the coordinate plane, and reflect them in the axes

To illustrate and name parts of circles, including radius, diameter and circumference and know that the radius is half the diameter.

To multiply simple pairs of proper fractions, writing the answer in its simplest form.

To divide proper fractions by whole numbers and associate a fraction with division and calculate decimal fraction equivalents.

English Key Skills

To read books that are structured in different ways and identify the key points in a text.

To identify the audience and purpose of the writing.

To choose the appropriate form and register for the audience and purpose of the writing.

To use commas to mark phrases and clauses

To apply knowledge of root words, prefixes and suffixes to read aloud and to understand the meaning of unfamiliar words.

To understand the rules for adding prefixes and suffixes - form verbs with prefixes and convert nouns or adjectives into verbs by adding a suffix.

Topic Based Key Skills for the lead subjects this half term
