mícro- organisms	Are very tiny living things. They are so small that you need a microscope to see them.
classification	Grouping together of similar species of plant, animal and other organisms
algebra	A branch of maths that substitutes letters for numbers. Finding the unknown or putting real-life variables into equations and then solving them.
active voice	In an active sentence, the subject performs the action (the verb) to the object.
passive voice	In a passive sentence, the thing that would normally be the object gets turned into the subject through the use of the passive form of the verb.
camouflage	the way that the colour or shape of a human, animal or plant appears to mix with its natural environment to prevent it from being seen.
bridge hold	Hold the food to be cut between the fingers and thumb creating a bridge. The knife should go through the bridge to cut the food.
claw grip	Create a claw with your fingers, gripping the food and tipping the hand - claw, grip, tip, cut.
ranking	How web pages/search engines rank/order searched results.
network	A number of computers linked together to allow them to "talk" to each other and share resources.
