It has also come to my attention that children are not always seat belted as they leave. It is a legal requirement that seat belts are used wherever you sit in a car. Remember, it is the children who wear seatbelts in cars that survive crashes. Please read on as there is a section all about this as I would be devastated - as you all would - if it took a fatal injury to make everyone realize that change needs to happen.

Parking / Car Safety

PARKING - KINDNESS and CONSIDERATION to others.

Unfortunately, we continue to have a number of complaints about people parking inconsiderately on the church car park, especially at the end of the day. Please be mindful of other parents and carers and do not park your car in a place that is blocking other people in or preventing others gaining access. Please continue to report any incidents, along with a registration number to the office. Any registration numbers that have already been handed in, have been passed on to our School PCSO.

SEATBELTS

There has been reports that there are parents who have been seen beginning to drive without putting seatbelts on their children. Wearing a seatbelt is a legal requirement in the UK whether sitting in the front or the back of the vehicle. 30% of people who died in cars in 2021 were not wearing a seat belt – the highest percentage since modern records began. This amounts to over 200 deaths and many more serious injuries. Wearing a seat belt halves, the chances of dying in collision. It remains the bedrock of occupant protection, even in modern cars with airbags etc.

You can be fined up to £500 for not wearing a seat belt.

Wearing a seat belt not only helps protect your safety, it helps protect the safety of others.

Only one person is allowed in each seat fitted with a seat belt. Never use the same seat belt across two or more passengers.

As a passenger over the age of 14 it's your responsibility to ensure you're wearing a seat belt. Failure to do so could result in a fine.


Child passengers

Children under 135 cm (4'4") tall must be in the correct car seat for their height and weight.

You can be fined £500 if a child under 14 years old isn't in the correct car seat, or, if over 135cm tall, wearing a seatbelt whilst you are driving.

Attendance

The whole school's attendance this week was 93.55%.





Last week, we were visited by our school's attendance officer from the Lancashire County Council. As per her guidance, We will be monitoring the school's attendance very closely, Whether this be for sickness, holidays in term time or being late to school.

ABSENCE REPORTING

If your child is going to be late or absent for any reason then please call the school office and speak to a member of staff, leave a voicemail, send an email or a message via Arbor to the school. This must be done before the start of the school day which is 8:55am. You must call in everyday that your child is absent. Failure to do this will result in an unauthorised absence mark.

LATENESS

We are noticing a number of children who are late to school every morning. The school day start at 8:55am and we expect all children to be in school and ready for Registration at this time. Being late, not only disrupts the class but also causes problems with ordering school dinners. After the meeting with the LCC attendance officer, we have been informed that those who are persistently late will be marked as such in the register and this could lead to the parents receiving a fine.

If your child is going to be late to school for a specific reason i.e. A Medical Appointment, then school need to be informed before 8:55am. This is to ensure they are given the correct mark in the register and we can put their order in for a hot dinner if needed.

EID - For our Muslim families who will be soon observing the celebration of Eid, Children are authorised to have 1 day off from school. We are aware that Eid can be on different days and so we are happy for the children to take the one day off on the day that their family celebrates. Please update the school on your child's absence on the day.

They can be any size and made out of anything you like! Be as creative as possible...





Online Safety



With Christmas comes a wealth of new technology for children to enjoy. Family Link gives you access to manage your child's account and data settings. As a parent, you can help change or reset your child's password if they forget it, edit their personal information or even delete their account if you feel necessary. A QUICK GUIDE TO HEAD LICE





SYMPTOMS - DETECTION



The main symptom is an itchy scalp. Children may hardly notice head lice or may have only a vague scalp irritation.



Move a fine-tooth comb through wet hair from the scalp outward. Lice are usually found at the back of the head or behind the ears.



Eggs (or nits) are oval-shaped, grayish white, and can be seen as tiny globules firmly stuck to the base of hair shafts. They're easier to see because they typically greatly outnumber lice.



Use a special shampoo, cream, or lotion to kill the lice eggs. To get rid of them, use a fine-tooth comb to carefully pick them out.

CARE



Wash your bedding and clothes in hot water. These items should probably be dried in a drying machine that reaches 130° F (54° C) for about 30 minutes.



Place anything that can't be washed in airtight plastic bags for 2 weeks to kill the lice.



TRANSMISSION

Head lice are most common among girls aged 5-11, but can affect almost anyone. The infestation is spread by close personal contact and possibly by shared combs, brushes, hats, and other personal items.

Being clean does not prevent getting head lice. There is no association between head lice and poor hygiene or low socioeconomic status.
